December 16th 2007: The Third Sunday of Advent "Gaudete"



THE LAST WEEK OF ADVENT

Tomorrow, Monday 17th is the beginning of the second and final part of Advent which is the immediate preparation for the Solemnity of Our Lord's birth. Each day is marked by a special Antiphon which is sung at Vespers with great solemnity in Monasteries and Cathedrals, where the Abbot or one of the principal Canons will vest as at Sunday Vespers and intone this antiphon before the Magnificat is sung and the Altar incensed, just as we do every Sunday here. They are called the "O" Antiphons for the simple reason that they all begin with this same cry, "O", calling out to Christ to come. You will find the text of each of them on the next page as given for each of the seven days before Christmas Eve.

Each antiphon takes an image of the Saviour drawn from the Old Testament and addresses Christ as the Lord who is fast approaching: e.g. "O Wisdom", and then calls out with longing for

the Lord to "Come!" and set us free from the darkness of sin. Christ as the Son of God before ever He became a man is often referred to as the "Wisdom" of God who shares God's own nature. "Adonai" is a Hebrew word meaning Mighty Lord, reminding us that Christ, being God, appeared to Moses on Mount Horeb in the Burning Bush, and on Sinai to give him the Commandments. "Root of Jesse" refers to Jesse, the father of King David, who is one of Our Lord's human ancestors. "Key of David" speaks of the role of Our Lord as the King, the son of David, who alone has power to release mankind from the prison of sin. "Morning Star" reminds us of the prophecy of John the Baptist's father, Zechariah, who sees the coming of Christ as the dawn of a new day of salvation coming at the end of the dark night — an appropriate image at this darkest time of the year! "King of the Nations" reminds us that Christ is not only the King of the Jews, but of all mankind, as we will once again see at the Epiphany when the Magi represent all the pagan nations of the world worshipping Christ as God the Redeemer. Finally, we will ourselves sing the last antiphon here next Sunday at Vespers: "O Emmanuel", the name which the Prophet Isaiah tells us means "God is with us"; reminding us that in the Incarnation, God Himself becomes a man in order to dwell with us. You may also note that these themes will also appear in the Alleluia before the Gospel at Mass each day of the week.

THE NATIVITY TRAIL

If you find yourselves in town any day between now and January 4th, I would urge you to take time out of the frantic rush and go and see a beautiful exhibition of Christmas paintings entitled the "Nativity Trail" in the City Art Gallery between the Town Hall, Paradise Forum and the Council House. There is a free explanatory booklet to guide you around. It not only tells the Christmas story for the benefit of those who don't know it already, but also explains some of the features of the art works themselves. The paintings are all part of the permanent holdings of the Gallery, and they are very fine, being also of many styles and dates. Also, it is free—there is no admission charge! So take as many family and friends as you like. If you do go, please make sure to thank the staff, and tell them that you have appreciated their arranging it at this time of the year, and that you enjoyed it (assuming that you did! Well, I certainly did so!)

OUR LADY'S DECEMBER FEASTS: IMMACULATE CONCEPTIONGUADALUPE-HER EXPECTATION

On the solemnity of the Immaculate Conception the Gospel of the Annunciation told how the ever-sinless Mary heard Gabriel's message from God and willingly became God's Mother. Last Wednesday was the feast of Our Lady's appearance at Guadalupe in Mexico, honoured as "Patroness of the Unborn". Next Tuesday was formerly kept as the memorial of Our Lady's Expectation, a fitting commemoration in the days before the birth of her Son; and next Sunday's Gospel tells of St. Joseph's acceptance of the divine origin of Mary's child. All these commemorations of Our Lady during December speak of her carrying the Son of God in her womb, a fitting time to pray for all unborn children and their protection, so maybe you might continue to pray the Novena prayer to Our Lady of Guadalupe (available at the Church doors) during this period? Also, the "Helpers of God's Precious Infants" will make a brief appeal at the end of Mass for us to help them.
