

4th 2008: THE SOLEMNITY OF THE ASCENSION (Transferred)

CHRIST AT THE FATHER'S RIGHT HAND

Eastertide's second period begins today with the Ascent of our Risen Lord to the Father's Right Hand in Heaven. From Easter Day, Jesus assured His Apostles of His Resurrection by His many appearances to them and taught them that all He had achieved in His Paschal Mystery (His Passion, Death, Resurrection and Glorification at the Father's Side) would now be imparted to them through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

His last act on earth is to tell His Apostles that they must wait in prayer in the Upper Room in Jerusalem where they have met Him already many times since His rising from the dead. There they will be filled with the Holy Spirit and empowered by Him to go out to the whole world and preach the Gospel of salvation, baptising all nations in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

St. Luke tells us that as the Apostles watched their Lord being taken from their sight they were interrupted by two men in white who brought their attention back to earth: "Why are you men from Galilee looking up into the sky? Jesus, whom you have seen taken into heaven, He will return in the same way that you have seen Him go." Thus, at the last moment of His earthly life, Our Lord's future return in glory is brought to mind. Hence the Apostles returned to Jerusalem just as they had been told, not sorrowfully, but with great rejoicing. This is very significant. Our Lord's departure might have seemed like a bereavement, had He not already promised "I will not leave you orphans, I will return to you". The manner of His return, however, will be different. Just as His return to them after His resurrection was so different from His earthly appearance that they failed to recognise Him straightaway, so His return after His ascension into heavenly glory will also be different again.

It is His promised gift of the Holy Spirit who will make Him present to His followers once more. This presence will be spiritual and will be internal—not a visible presence, but an indwelling in the souls of those who receive the Spirit in His Name. It is through the Holy Spirit that we recognise Christ as present in His Church now and always until He comes again in glory. It is through the Holy Spirit's work within the Church that Christ makes Himself present to us in the Sacraments.

THE MONTH OF MAY

This year, owing to the exceptionally early Easter, May is unusually rich with feasts. Each Sunday this month is a great feast. Following today's feast of the Ascension we will celebrate on each of the succeeding three Sundays: Pentecost, Trinity Sunday and Corpus Christi. The day following Corpus Christi will be the solemnity of our own St. Philip, and in that same week on the last two days of May we will celebrate the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Visitation of Our Lady.

It is fitting that May closes with a special feast of Our Lady since the whole month is dedicated to her. But it is also typical of Our Lady that throughout her special month she directs our attention to so many great mysteries of our Faith: the Glorification of her Son in heaven; the mission to the Church of the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity at Pentecost; the gift of her Son's Body and Blood in Holy Communion at Corpus Christi; the infinite love of her Divine Son for fallen humanity revealed in His Sacred Heart, which is the fountain of sacramental life poured out in the blood and water flowing from His side on the cross.

This also reveals a wonderful truth to us; by honouring the Mother of God we are not diverted away from God but rather we are brought ever closer to Him. What more fitting way could there be to begin this special month than by coming to take part this afternoon in the Procession and Crowning of Our Lady's statue? We should place this month under Our Lady's patronage so that we may draw greater spiritual benefit from all that it offers us. In addition, on every weekday evening this month at 7.45 p.m. we offer you the opportunity to join us in honouring Our Lady with devotions enriched by Cardinal Newman's wonderful meditations. This coming week we also continue preparing for Pentecost with the Church's oldest Novena, that which was first prayed by Our Lady and the Apostles in the Upper Room in Jerusalem. Later in the month the May devotions will be augmented by a Novena in preparation for the Solemnity of St. Philip. Please make an effort to come to as many of these wonderful prayerful celebrations as you can. "Unless we show devotion, we will never grow in devotion!"
