# September 12th 2010: THE TWENTY-FOURTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



### THE BEATIFICATION OF CARDINAL NEWMAN

The Pope has stated that the most important aspect of his forthcoming visit to this country is the beatification of Cardinal Newman. This is in recognition of the enormous influence which our Cardinal has had both on the Pope personally and on the Church since his own lifetime which ended one hundred and twenty years ago.

The Pope will make the declaration that Cardinal Newman is among the Blessed in heaven shortly after the beginning of Mass next Sunday in Cofton Park. Those of you who will be there on the day know that you will be present at a truly historical moment. There will be several "firsts" on this occasion: Cardinal Newman will be the first Englishman, other than one of the martyrs, to be beatified since the Reformation. He will be the first person, and so far the only one, to be beatified by the present Pope in person. Pope Benedict does us all an enormous honour by agreeing to come to England to do this deed. From that moment next Sunday morning, Cardinal Newman will be known as "Blessed John Henry Newman", at least until the time, God willing, when he is canonised a Saint.



### SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS AT THE ORATORY ON SUNDAY 19th SEPTEMBER

- 1. MASS AT THE ORATORY: Because of the Beatification Mass at Cofton at 10 a.m., followed by the Pope's personal visit to the Oratory, there will now be only TWO MASSES in church next Sunday: first, at 8 a.m. a Low Latin Mass in the Extraordinary Form, and secondly at 8.30 a.m. a Low Mass in English. Entry will be by the Plough & Harrow Road door only and as there may be a search, bags should not be brought in. There will be no Sunday evening Mass at all. N.B. The Saturday evening Vigil Mass will take place as usual at 5.45 p.m.
- 2. Please note that there will be no parking permitted in the Oratory Car Park for security reasons from Saturday evening until after the Pope has left. Therefore all who come to Mass by car will have to be prepared to find on-street parking spaces.

### SPECIAL ARRANGEMENTS FOR SEEING THE POPE ARRIVE AT THE ORATORY

- 3. Those who are *not* going to Cofton Park will be allowed to stand outside the front of the Newman Building (formerly St. Philip's College) on the Hagley Road to welcome the Pope as he arrives at the Oratory in the Popemobile.
- 4. Access to this area will be by ticket only. Tickets will be issued at the door of the Oratory House from Monday morning this week on a first-come, first-served basis.
  - 5. Everyone will have to be in place by 11 a.m., about two hours before the Pope is due to arrive.
- 6. Toilet facilities and refreshments will be available at the Ivy Bush. Water and First Aid will also be available. Stewards will be on duty and clearly recognisable throughout the day, even after the Pope has left. We hope that there will be an opportunity on the day to buy papal flags to wave as the Pope passes by.

#### VISITS TO THE NEW SHRINE OF BLESSED JOHN HENRY NEWMAN

- 7. After the Pope has left the Oratory there will be a short interval while preparations are made for the faithful to visit the shrine and pray there to the new Blessed. Oratory Parishioners who have been outside the Newman Building will be first to be allowed into Church. Stewards will guide you. The same arrangements will hold on Sunday afternoon and Monday.
  - 8. Priests will be available for confession throughout Sunday afternoon and all day Monday.
- 9. The exhibition in the Upper Cloister Hall, and the Repository (Piety Stall and Bookshop) in the Lower Cloister Hall will be open throughout the time of the public visits on Sunday and throughout Monday.
- 10. Visitors will be admitted to the Church on Sunday until 6 p.m. only. Thereafter the Church will be closed for the preparations to be made for Vespers at 7.30 p.m.

Monday 13th September: St John Chrysostom, Bishop & Doctor of the Church. | September 19th: the Twenty-fifth Memoria. (White)

Holy Hour 8 a.m. -9 a.m.

St John Chrysostom (C.347-407) Born at Antioch. He tried the monastic life but it ruined his health. He then became a priest and was soon famous throughout the East for his eloquent sermons which earned him the nickname 'Chrysostom' (golden-mouthed). In 398, he was appointed Patriarch of Constantinople, where he fearlessly criticised the Emperor's corrupt rule, and supported the weak and poor. His sycophantic, weakminded fellow bishops had him exiled. But public opinion was so strong that he returned triumphantly. However, despite the Pope's fierce opposition, he was exiled again for his outspoken denunciations of vice in the royal court and the capital city.

Tuesday 14th September: The Exaltation of the Holy Cross. Feast. (Red)

**The Exaltation of the Holy Cross** emphasises Our Lord's victory on the Cross rather than His sufferings. Both aspects are vital to our understanding of what Our Lord has done

Wednesday 15th September: Our Lady of Sorrows (Formerly Our Lady of Ransom). Memoria. (White).

Holy Hour 8 a.m. -9 a.m.

**Our Lady of Sorrows** is fittingly celebrated on the day following the feast of her Son's being lifted high on the Cross. But we remember that it was precisely when she stood at the foot of the Cross that she accepted us as her children, for which we must never cease to be grateful.

Thursday 16th September: St Cornelius, Pope Martyr, and St Cyprian, Bishop & Martyr. Memoria. (Red)

Holy Hour 8 a.m.—9 a.m.

St Cornelius and St Cyprian (d. 253 & 258) These two saints are included in the Roman Canon of the Mass. Cyprian was a staunch supporter of Pope Cornelius who was opposed as he favoured a sensitive and forgiving approach to those who had lapsed and wanted to return to the Church. Both were martyred under the Emperor Decius.

Friday 17th September: Feria. (Green). Optional memoria of St Robert **Bellarmine**, Bishop & Doctor of the Church. Memoria. (White)

Holy Hour 8 a.m. -9 a.m.

St Robert Bellarmine (1542-1621) An Italian scholar and Jesuit, he became an "Apologist", one who defends Catholic Doctrine against its opponents. Several of his writings were published in English, some secretly. He became a theological adviser to several Popes, but his advice to his friend Galileo when he was in trouble for confusing science and scripture, was sadly ignored.
