# September 30th 2007: The Twenty-sixth Sunday of the Year



#### FORTY HOURS DEVOTION

As you entered the Church today you will have seen immediately that the Sanctuary is almost ready for the "Forty Hours", our annual Eucharistic Festival. I say "almost" ready for a very important reason. There are two things that yet remain before we can say that the preparations are complete: the first is that on Tuesday night after the end of the High Mass of the Blessed Sacrament at 8 p.m., the Host, Our Lord's Sacred Body, will be placed reverently and gloriously on its throne, adorned by the great forest of candles and flowers and hangings which are there to honour the Real Presence on our Altars and in our tabernacles of the Son of God made man.

But there is a second thing that still needs to be present before the Forty Hours can really begin—that is YOU! It would be a sad and empty show to put up so many candles and flowers to adorn the Body of our Saviour *if there were no-body to worship Him*. It is gratifying to recall that in recent years the number of people coming to pray in Our Lord's presence has risen. But it is still a cause of sadness to Our Lord that many still do not come to worship Him and ask Him for all the blessings He longs to pour out on us all.

How many of you who read this Newsletter and who come to Mass regularly on a Sunday have never come to any other event in the Church during the week? Our Lord gave us the gift of His Body and Blood not just for a few but for "the many", meaning all people. Put simply, "for all people" means that everyone is invited to come and find Our Lord, to pray for themselves and their loved ones, for peace in the world, for respect for Life and for the conversion of poor sinners. We know that not everyone accepts Our Lord's invitation. That is terribly sad. But would you who read this want to be one of those? What will you do during those precious hours between Tuesday night and Thursday night when Our Lord is waiting here for YOU? It's not that He needs us to come; it's simply because of His great love that He has so much He wants to give us. But He can only give it to us if we are prepared to make the small effort needed to come into His presence.

So make a resolution today that you are going to spend a little time in Our Lord's presence during the Forty Hours. Make your resolution good by signing up on the Watching List at the Back of the Church to spend just 30 minutes. Our Lord never fails to reward all those who spend time with Him for love of Him. He will also give great blessings to all those for whom you pray, and just think how many serious intentions there are that need praying for in today's world! You won't regret it! That's a guarantee, not from me but from Our Lord Himself. Try it and see!

### THE DIVINE INNOCENCE

Some of you may have heard of the "Divine Innocence" movement and devotion. You will therefore be interested to learn that the Church definitely does not approve of it. After careful investigation of some of Patricia de Menezes writings the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith, until recently headed by the Pope himself, has written to the Archbishop of Southwark (in whose diocese Mrs de Menezes lives) to make this known.

There are four parts to the statement. 1) An exaggerated view of the importance of her "Order" - she claims that our Lord says that: "The Order of MY Divine Innocence precedes all orders, and supersedes all orders." 2) Inappropriate words and phrases are attributed to Our Lord: e.g. "De Menezes: Lord, the Way of Divine Innocence does not seem to be what the young want. Jesus: What do the young want? De Menezes: Excitement. Jesus: I can give them enough excitement to give them a heart attack!" 3) Her demand that the Church declare all victims of abortion as martyrs is not, as claimed, a development of doctrine. Rather it is an innovation which is difficult to harmonize with the teaching of the Church. 3) Her unusually violent and threatening language used in the "inspirations" to attack the authorities of the Church seems incompatible with any genuinely divine revelation: "Jesus: Those who subject the children to trial by neglect, I will subject to trial by fire. … Wicked short-sighted shepherds. … Vengeance is mine!. The Church stands accused of impeding Jesus' efforts to save the souls of millions of aborted children. Anyone who in interested in reading the entire text of the decree will find copies at the Church Doors.

**St Thérèse of Liseux** (1873-97) "The Little Flower" Was endowed with a remarkable grace and knowledge of divine things. Her great desire was to join the Carmelites, following in the footsteps of her eldest sister, and she personally obtained permission from Pope Leo XIII to enter at 15, well below the minimum age. Shortly before her death, aged 24, she wrote a remarkable autobiography, the "Story of a Soul". Her example can be summed up in her own words: "Love proves itself by deeds, so how am I to show my love? Great deeds are forbidden to me.. The only way I can prove my love is by scattering flowers and these flowers are every little sacrifice, every glance and word, and the doing of the least actions for love". She was made a Doctor of the Church by Pope John Paul II

St Luigi Scrosoppi A priest at the Undine Oratory, his life spanned the entire 19th century, a time of great turmoil for the Church in Italy. He suffered these trials with great fortitude and founded two orders of nuns to care for the sick and needy.
